As we start 2021 it is uplifting to have a fresh start after everything, we endured in 2020. On March 8th, 2020, the society held their **2nd Annual Seedy Sunday**. It was well attended with a Dixie land band playing on stage, many tables with plants, compost education, mason bees, Stocking Creek farms, honey jam, and many other vendors.

COVID-19 forced the closure of the Centre in mid-March 2020 with the Society canceling our 1st Annual Spring Craft Market, community hall meeting, Chemainus Art Group Show, John Gogo Concert, Yoga, Fitness for Life classes.

Many of our regular users, such as the Saltair Quilters were affected by the closure as well.

We reopened August 4th, with our COVID-19 Safety Plan in place, but by October we were in a full shut down again, resulting in having to cancel our 2nd Annual Winter Market.

The Saltair Childcare (ILM) moved the front outdoor play area to the rear east end of the Community Centre property.

Elections BC rented a large portion of the Centre as headquarters for Provincial elections.

With all these changes happening at the Centre, it is obvious when I look back at what we have accomplished, from accepting the restrictions - physical distancing, wearing masks, sanitizing, still volunteering to make the Centre a safe place to be in the face of the pandemic, and assessing your own health, I want to Thank You all.

Thanks to everyone's commitment in making sure that the Community Centre is safe for everyone once the restrictions are lifted.
